

**Community Service Quilts (CSQ) Committee** 

The Community Service Quilt Committee was established at the March meeting. New to the committee this year will be Kristy Yenkey and Jodi Britt. Thank you to these ladies for taking on this roll!

Clover House will be receiving our first batch of guilts. We encourage you to look up this organization at www.clover-house.org. Created by St. Francis Ministries, Clover House is the first program in Kansas that helps adolescence female survivors move from hurt to healing to wholeness. The girls living at Clover House are survivors of Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children. CSEC is a form of human trafficking that preys on the vulnerabilities of youth through the exchange of anything of value for sexual acts. Without the restorative intervention, survivors of CSEC often face lives of brokenness and addiction, legal problems, and mental health challenges. Clover House works to replace risk with resiliency by addressing the mental, physical, relational, and spiritual healing necessary for youth to move forward in wholeness and strength. Hopefully we will have a representative from Clover House at the April Meeting or perhaps the May meeting to further explain the mission and other ways we might be helpful. We would be happy to have referrals from all of the members of Silver Needles if you are aware of a group in need...give us their contact information and we will rally!!!


