Every tiny piece of paper and pre-cut fabric scraps were neatly arranged in her bead box along with her thread, needles, needle threader and scissors. She is always ready to take her project wherever she might go; she never leaves behind something that she needs because it is all right there in one box. What a clever and practical idea!


