# MEET OUR MEMBERS!

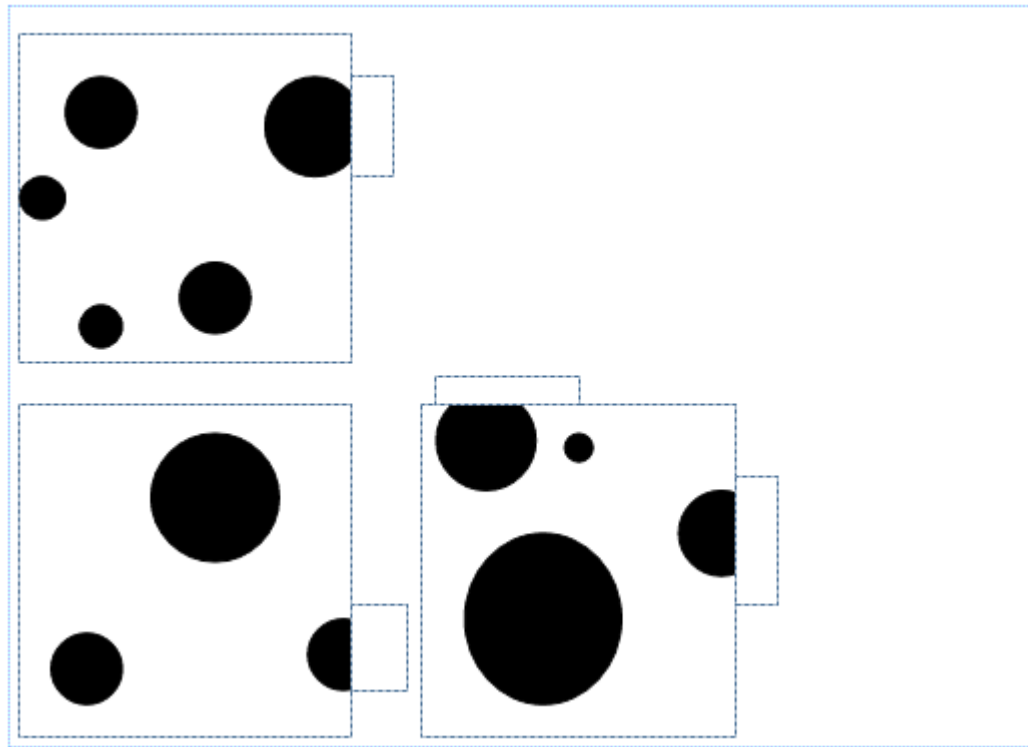

**Let's Thank Our President For A Job Well Done!!!**



Using a white cotton 8 1/2 inch piece of fabric (so finished size will be 8 inches) appliqué 3 to 5 solid black cotton fabric dots. The dots can be varying sizes and can even be on the edge so that one dot may be cut in half. Use different color thread to zig-zag the dots onto the background - or whatever kind of stitching method you prefer to attach the dots to the background. For example you could put a 2 inch diameter dot zigzagged on to the white background using purple thread, another dot 1 inch in diameter attached with red thread and another dot 3 inches in diameter stitched on using orange thread - got the idea?
