Door prizes were awarded to Pam Jones, Debbie Weber, and Joan White.

The minutes were corrected to include last month's program was provided by Patty Pearce of Lawrence. Patty presented the program "Table Talk." The minutes were approved as corrected.

The treasurer's report was approved and will be filed for audit.

Judy announced that Ann Jordan had made copies of the membership list for paid members and the lists are available on the table to be picked up. Members were encourage to also pick up their nametags at the table.

Judy expressed thanks to Rosie for the newsletters and reminded members the deadline for next newsletter is June 4, 2018.

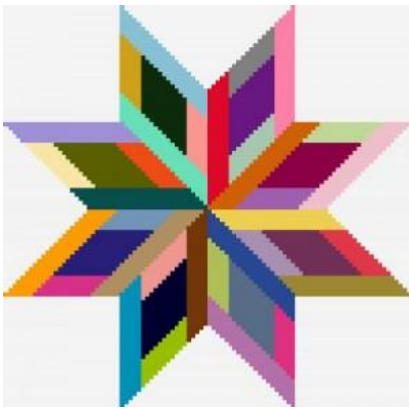

It is not too early to get those auction items started.

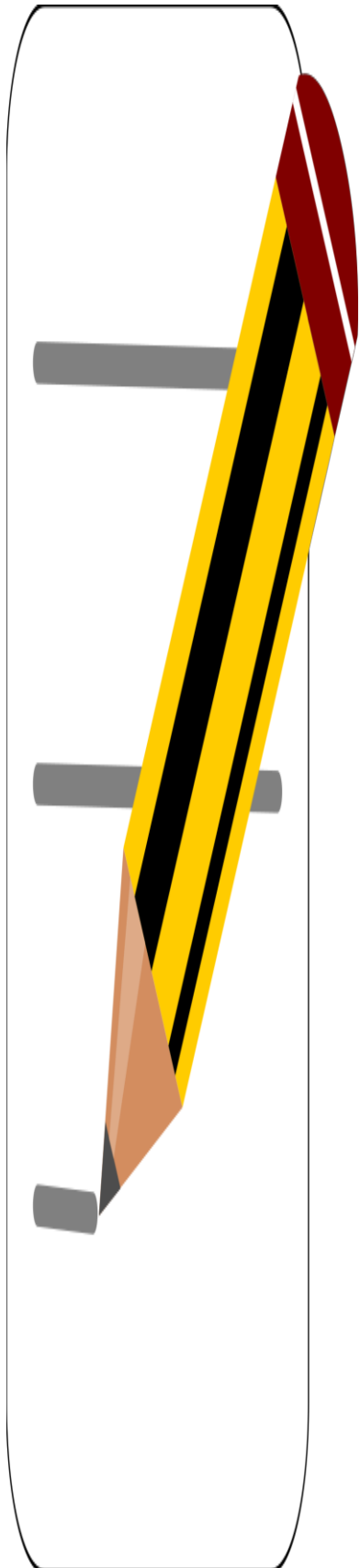
We have attached to this newsletter, the forms for the Mini Auction and Quilt Show.

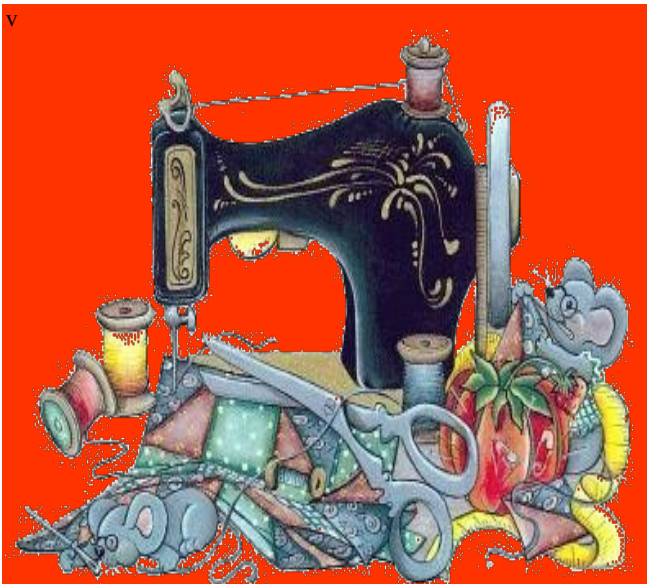

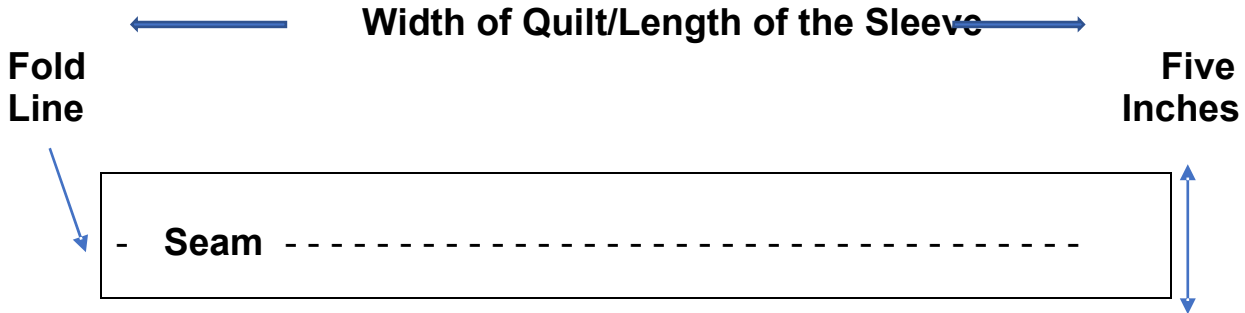

MAKING HANGING SLEEVE

All large quilts need to have a hanging sleeve for the quilt show. To make a temporary sleeve for the show use an old bed sheet, muslin or fabric. You can cut or rip it as long as the width of the quilt X 10 inches wide. Fold the fabric lengthwise in half. (NOW: Sleeve is width of Quilt X 5 inches).



Stitch a long seam to make a tube, flatten tube against the quilt. You do not have to mess with turning the tube, just leave as shown above. Then long baste or safety pin on both sides of the sleeve to the quilt. The tube will protect the back of the quilt and will be wide enough for the rods of the quilt stands. Example of basting below.
