
Dear Quilting Friends,



Our Quilt Show is a month away and this is our ONLY Fundraiser! We are in need of three more hostesses and members, friends, etc. to fill the tables.







MAKING HANGING SLEEVE

All large quilts need to have a hanging sleeve for the quilt show. To make a temporary sleeve for the show use an old bed sheet, muslin or fabric. You can cut or rip it as long as the width of the quilt X 10 inches wide. Fold the fabric lengthwise in half. (NOW: Sleeve is width of Quilt X 5 inches).



Stitch a long seam to make a tube, flatten tube against the quilt. You do not have to mess with turning the tube, just leave as shown above.

Then long baste or safety pin on both sides of the sleeve to the quilt. The tube will protect the back of the quilt and will be wide enough for the rods of the quilt stands. Example of basting below.
